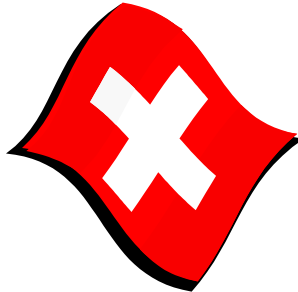
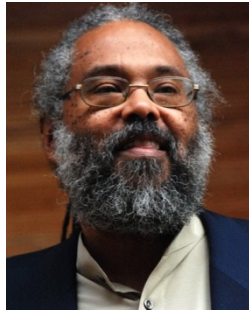


## An evening with Rev. Mark Morrison-Reed

African-American writers James Baldwin and Vincent O. Carter wrote about what it felt like to live between cultures and of the tension and self-consciousness that awoke in them while living in Switzerland during the 1950s. It is an experience shared by **Mark Morrison-Reed** and which contributes to his new book, *Voices from the Margins*. The writings within it remind us of what we miss when we don't listen to marginalized voices and the amazing insights we stand to gain when we do. **Join us for an evening of readings and conversation.**

In 1962 when Morrison-Reed was a teen, his father took an appointment at the University of Bern and Mark attended the Swiss Ecole d'Humanité, a multicultural boarding school on the Hasliberg. Off-and-on he lived in Switzerland for six years and over the last decade has returned annually. Currently he serves as Unitarian Universalist Association Ambassador to the UU fellowships in the Netherlands, Paris, Basel and Geneva; and as an Affiliated Faculty member at Meadville Lombard Theological School in Chicago. He makes his home in Toronto.
